**Bossier Sheriff's Young Marines** began in 2002 and has impacted the lives for nearly 1,100 young men and women who have graduated from the program. The Young Marines is a youth education and service program for boys and girls aged 8 through high school and promotes the mental, moral and physical development of the youth. It was officially chartered by the Marine Corps League as a national program in 1965, focuses on character-building and leadership and promotes a healthy drug-free lifestyle. In early 2013, Bossier Sheriff Whittington was faced with a decision of having to remove voluntary prayer and the mention of God from the local program in order to receive \$30,000 in federal grant money. He said voluntary prayer and the mention of God would remain in the program, and since that time, the community and well-wishers have stepped forward and donated to the Young Marines program so that it can continue to positively influence the lives of young men and women in northwest Louisiana.
